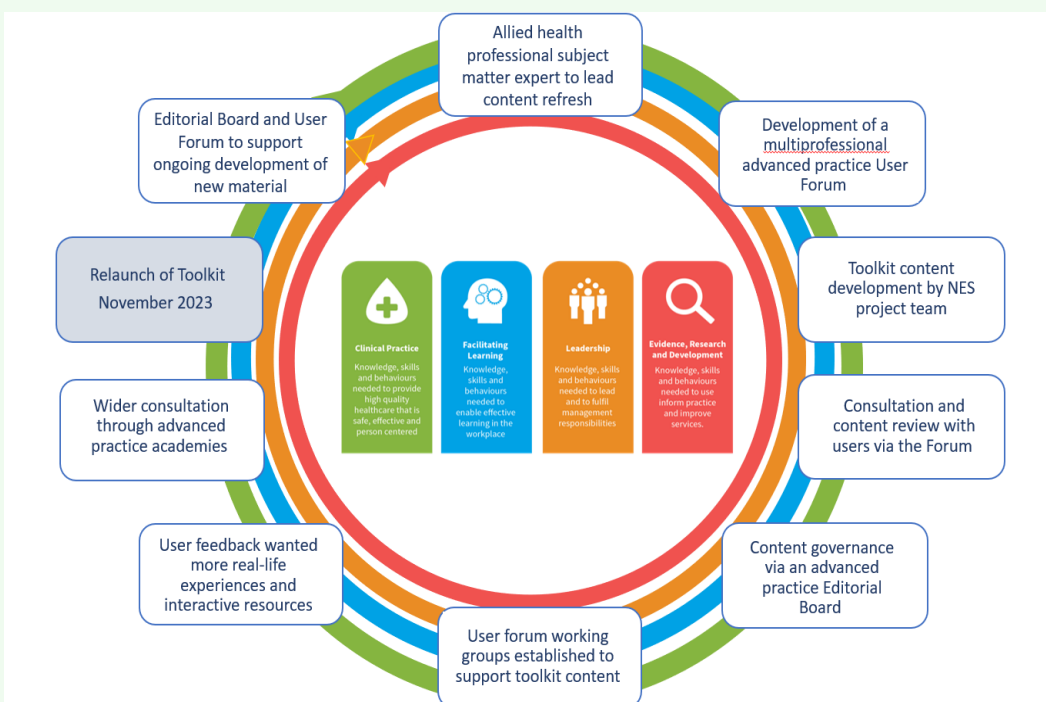

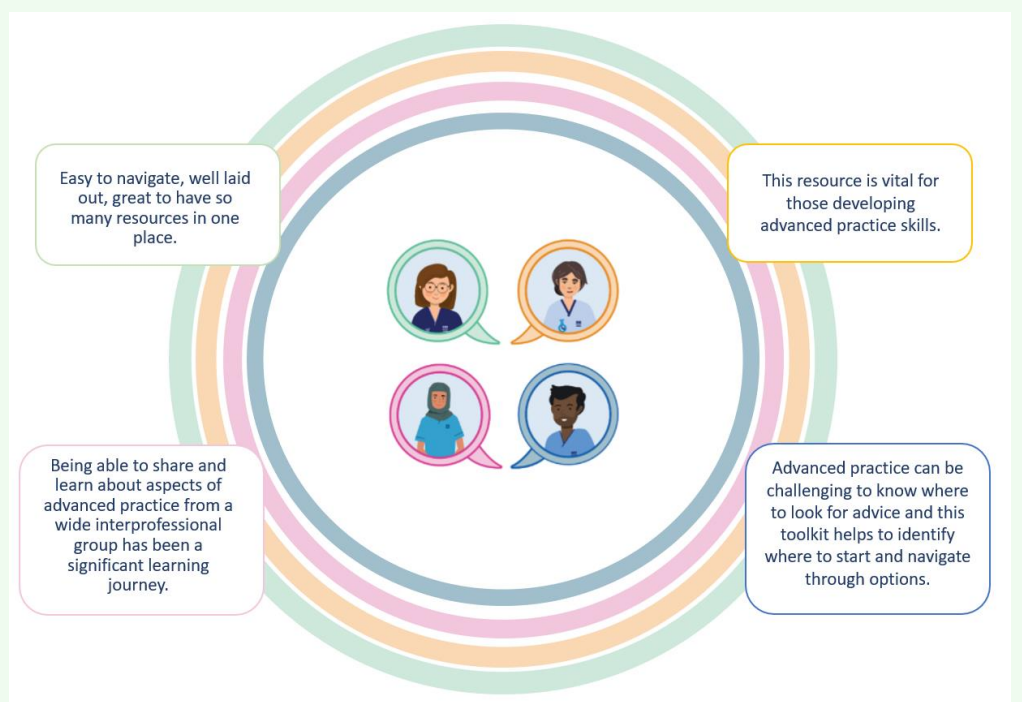
Background and Aim

The Advanced Practice Toolkit was originally designed to give practitioners, educators and managers easy access to credible and supportive resources and information on advanced practice. Advanced practice is dynamic and ever changing so the toolkit needed to be refreshed to reflect the new multiprofessional workforce across Scotland.
